Your child's vision significantly affects learning. If children can't see the words on a page, they may feel frustrated and learn to dislike reading. If children can't read an assignment written on a board, they may fall behind. Impaired vision can result in squinting, headaches, and lack of enthusiasm about reading and school work.
